### Dear Friends,

One of the joys of preparing an annual report is that it gives us a chance to look back and to be thankful for all that has been accomplished. Here are some highlights of what your support made happen this past year.

- Share the Love Campaign with Mark Miller Subaru raised over \$65,000

- Offered virtual support during state-wide shutdown.
- Hosted second annual grief support summer camp in partnership with Primary Children's Hospital and Camp Comfort Zone.
- Retained 100% of staff during state-wide shutdown.

"For me, there's not necessarily a single magic moment that stands out from my new group at Taylorsville, but a myriad of small moments. When I started my group, I was nervous about getting too heavy too fast. I knew many of the kids had their person die just two or three months earlier and this would be one of their first experiences talking about it. One night, I decided to just go for it and try discussing the day their person died.


One little boy got really nervous and asked me if he could skip questions. I told him that was fine, and that if he decided he felt comfortable, he could change his mind. We went around the circle and everyone shared. After hearing the others, so did this little boy. I was so proud of how well the kids handled these hard questions, and even more amazed at how these kids, who have only met each other one other time, were able to listen, connect with one another, and feel safe enough to share. I think that's the magic of The Sharing Place. Even during the first couple of groups, kids can sense that this is a safe place and that we are all there to support one another."




### 2019-2020 GROUPS
